# TREASURER'S REPORT



January 2024 financial summary showed a checking account beginning balance of \$6,672.51, with income from dues of \$90.00 and reimbursements and payments of

\$228.88 (\$50.00 T. Sherman and \$178.88 G. Miyamoto for Bd. Meeting and Website) leaving an ending balance of \$6,533.63, and a balance of \$2,709.68 in the savings account.

February 2024 financial report showed a checking account beginning balance of \$6,533.63 with income of \$285.00 from dues, \$870.00 for February luncheon, donation of \$15.00 (R. Higa, P. Apo) and Misc. \$20.00. Dragonflies catch 95%




